Dalgarno students visit Morocco as first overseas team to play in Ait-Melloul's football tournament

The thirteen day trip to Morocco by a group of young students (and footballers!) from Dalgarno Supplementary School was to participate in the Annual Springtime Football Tournament hosted in Agadir by Ait Melloul Football Club. Dalgarno Supplementary School were the first foreign team to take part in this tournament which has run in Ait Melloul for six years. The players also toured to the South of Morocco and played a friendly match with local team Raja in Casablanca.

A lot of preparation and organisation work had to be done prior to the trip. The Dalgarno school party comprised 23 members this year - 16 children between the ages of 10 and 12 years attended, with 2 coaches, 4 parents and the manager. Last year we had taken a group of sixteen year-olds when we first participated in a tournament in Morocco.

Departure to Morocco was on the 6th April. The team flew from London to Casablanca by Royal Air Maroc - without whose support the trip might not have been possible. We had only a quick stop in Casablanca allowing just enough time to get our connecting flight to Agadir's al Massira Airport. When we arrived at the airport we were met by a very friendly welcoming committee from the Club and Town Council and were then taken to the Ait Melloul Sports Centre, where we stayed for the duration of the our stay in Agadir.

The next day we met with the President of the Ait Melloul Sport Centre, Mr Hussein Adardour, who is also the leader of Ait Melloul's City Council. He gave us a welcoming reception and told us the programme for the football tournament.

The sports campus where we stayed was first class with the latest facilities and comforts and during our stay we benefited from a 24-seater coach that was at our disposition 24 hours a day as well as constant police security around the clock! We had 3 days before the start of the tournament and we used the time to do some sightseeing and visited the so-called Birds Valleys which are home to some of Morocco's rarest birds and animals. We also spent a day in the Taghazout beach resort which the everyone enjoyed immensely.

The tournament was opened by a representative of the Moroccan government, the Governor of the Inzegan-Ait Melloul, accompanied by the local member of parliament and other dignitaries including the local commander of police and the local councillor. The opening speech was given by the President of the Club on the theme of fair play. He reiterated the words of our Glorious King Mohamed VI on the importance of sport in the physical and mental development of young people and then declared the tournament open. The stadium was full to capacity with local people, football supporters, a plethora of musical bands from the Souss area, and the 12 football teams taking part. The first kick of the opening match was symbolically taken by the governor!

The 12 football Clubs who, took part in the tournament, came from different parts of Morocco, and the Dalgarno supplementary school represented the UK! Dalgarno came fourth overall in the tournament.

The success of this trip was very much due to the support of the Royal Air Maroc in London. The support of their Director and staff in London enabled the children from North Kensington to take part. We hope that some of these children will be a part of the future of Morocco, and of course that they will visit the country again. A big part of the trip for them was being able to see the south of Morocco for the first time and having a positive experience and outlook on their mother country. They were able to use their own Arabic language and solidify their relationship and love for their country and at the end some did not want to return to England but would have preferred to extend their stay in Casablanca if it were possible!

Speaking at a reception to mark the end of the tournament, Mohamed Benrahma of DSS thanked our hosts, he said:

"In the name of Allah the most Merciful, the most Compassionate. Your Honour, his Majesty's Prefect; your honour the Leader of Ait Melloul Council and Chair of Ait Melloul's Club; ladies and gentlemen. On this happy occasion and on behalf of Dalgarno School's football team, I would like to thank Ait Melloul United Sports Club, especially its president, Mr Al Hussein Adardour, for their hospitality towards us during our participation in this Spring childrens' tournament. Which was up to required standards. We hope to participate in the next tournament, God willing.

I would also like to thank the club's officials for their kind treatment to us throughout our stay in Ait Melloul, the local authority, as well as the police for their sustained efforts to ensure our safety and comfort. We sincerely hope that we get the opportunity to invite Ait Melloul's team to London as a way of consolidating our brotherly relationship and creating the right environment to promote partnership in sport and raise the standards reached by our children."

The children, their parents, the coaches and the organisers would also like to thank Royal Air Maroc, its director and its staff both in UK and Morocco for their help and support and for their excellent customer service.

Classes are held on Friday evenings from 6.30pm—8.30pm and Sundays from 11am—1pm.


